


Dating market is dramatically changing

Questions & Expectations

Motivation

- Individuals increasingly likely to be exposed to people who do not comply with traditional and gender-exclusive sexual behaviour
 - are these sexually modern individuals penalised on the dating market? evidence of persistent biases says we should (H1)
 - is this penalty gendered? we theorise penalty should be greater among women (H2)

Gender dynamics

 Wide body of literature shows men are significantly less tolerant of LGBTQ+ individuals/rights than women (so-called modern gender gap) Gender dynamics: meta-analysis



Gender dynamics

- When it comes to male gender norms, women are traditionalists (Lamont, 2014):
 - support gender-norms in dating scripts (Alba et al., 2023; Lever et al., 2015; Wu et al., 2023)
 - more prone to discriminate on gender congruent attributes like height (Stulp et al., 2013)
 - dislike men in traditional feminised jobs (Heilman & Wallen, 2010)
 - like daughters being masculine but dislike sons being feminine (Kane, 2006)


Empirical overview

Fielded an original survey among a representative sample from **Britain** and **Spain**.

Cases based on variation in pedigree of LGBTQ+ normalisation.

- Observational data: Self-reported indication that individual considers identifying as bisexual to be a "red flag" in a potential partner
- 2 Experimental data (I): Pre-registered double-list experiment
- Sexperimental data (II): Novel pre-registered (visual) conjoint experiment
- 4 Experimental data (III): Vignette experiment on gendered-penalty mechanism

- Gold-standard for reducing social desirability bias (Glynn, 2013; Rosenfeld et al., 2016)
- BUT comes with variance trade-off in estimating sensitive behaviour
 most lost experiment are severely under-powered Blair et al. (2020)
- Double-list experiment gets around trade-off by doubling power (Alvarez et al., 2019; Diaz, 2023; Droitcour et al., 1991)





Conjoint design (I)

Randomised a large number of attributes via both the profile image as well as the accompanying profile bio.

- Profile image: Gender, gender congruence, age, ethnicity, emotion
- Profile bio: (bi)sexuality, transgender, partisanship, education, occupation, distance, dating preferences (.e.g., hook up vs partner), diet (Spain only), gender pronouns (UK only), nationalism, hobbies





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




- Assumptions:

- Expectations:
 - Should a norm exist, individuals should anticipate it (empirical expectations)
 - Should gendered-penalty be driven by gender-incongruence, sexually modern men should be perceived as less gender-congruent by women

View of relative penalty/premium for men and women





- 1 Dating market competition? No
 - Assumption: rational to limit size of your market competition
- Sexual eroticism? No
 - Assumption: sexually modern women desirable to straight men
- 3 Statistical discrimination? No
 - Assumption: sexual modernity signals adjacent & correlated information
- 4 Bi-erasure (ID misclassification)? Unlikely
 - Assumption: Respondents believe sexually modern men are gay & sexually modern women are straight

- Do sexually modern individuals experience a penalty on the dating market? Yes
- Is this penalty on the dating market gendered? Also, yes

- Do sexually modern individuals experience a penalty on the dating market? Yes

- So what...?

Survey

- Signals an inconsistency between public & private inclusion towards sexually diverse individuals.
- Highlights (relative) role of women in consolidating traditional gender-congruent norms in social behaviour
- Likely contributes to explaining gender asymmetry in Bi identification
